Update on David Kauffman:

David is now halfway through his 5-year prison sentence. Someone of the family enjoys the 2-3 hour inperson visit approximately every 2 weeks 1 1/2 hours north of here. We can also communicate via phone or zoom calls.

Two weeks ago, three of us were privileged to attend David's high school graduation. It was good to experience an extended part of the SCI Mahanoy facility; to meet his teachers/staff members and to put faces to his friends. Security was extra high, making it cumbersome to navigate the 143 visitors invited to celebrate with the 96 graduates. Tense excitement was in the air, and there were guards in every corner. Needless to say, only 1/3 of the graduates had family/friends coming to support this moment in their lives. The lonely rest sat and wistfully watched. Either they had no one or family was just too far away. It made one's heart ache to observe the longing eyes in these adult men. There was a ceremony followed by a snack time of cookies and drink. After 4 hours, we left feeling exhausted but honored to be there.
