Hello Church Family,

Greetings from Cayo, Belize. It's been a week and a half since we arrived and things are going well. Our journey down however was a bit eventful. When we arrived at Harrisburg Airport at 6:00 am on Tuesday July 19, we realized our flight to Dallas was delayed till 1:00pm. This meant that we would miss our connecting flight to Belize. So, after a few phone calls, we checked in our 12 pieces of luggage and headed for Dallas. After arriving, we picked up our luggage and headed for a hotel in Dallas for the night. At this point we were all exhausted. The temperature in Dallas was a scorching 110 degrees! We were all exhausted from the trip, and Eden had a fever. Amidst the heat, sick or tired children, and the 12 heavy pieces of luggage, we did finally arrive at our hotel.

The next morning, we hauled our luggage back to Dallas airport for our flight to Belize. Although we had 12 pieces of luggage, it seemed that everywhere we went, someone volunteered to help me with the luggage. We arrived in Belize soon after lunch, picked up our luggage, and arrived safely in Cayo around 5:00 Wednesday evening.
